The project shall consist of dissertation to be submitted at the end of the course work of the IV semester. It shall consist of a minimum of 25 pages and a maximum of 50 pages, excluding the front page material and the bibliography (i.e., cover page, contents page, dedication).

It shall be typed on A4 sized sheets, one sided in Times Roman 12 point font and be doubled-spaced. The pages will have 1" margin on all sides and correspond very strictly to MLA style sheet convention (recent edition).

The supervisors shall certify that the submitted dissertation is a work actually carried out by the student. Dissertations may be ring-bound (spiral-binding) and students should not go for expensive binding.

The dissertation not conforming to the above requirements shall be rejected and students may be asked to re-submit their work. Plagiarism of any sort should be avoided and a candidate may be failed if the dissertation is found to contain unacknowledged sources. The dissertation should not contain materials from internet archives, Wikipedia and commercial notes
