

Regulations Governing the Choice Based Credit System Semester Scheme with Multiple Entry and Exit Options in the Undergraduate and Post-graduate Degree Programmes in the Faculties of Arts, Science and Commerce

(Framed under Section 44 (1) (c) of the KSU Act 2000)

Preamble:

Education plays a significant role in building a nation. There are quite a large number of educational institutions, engaged in imparting education in our country. However, our present education system is churning out youth who have to compete locally, regionally, nationally as well as globally. The 21st Century has opened up many new challenges in the field of Higher Education. The present alarming situation necessitates transformation and/or redesigning of the system, not only by introducing innovations but developing a "learner-centric" approach. But the majority of our higher education institutions have been following the system which obstructs the flexibility for the students to study the subjects/courses of their choice and their mobility to different institutions. Thus, there is a need to allow flexibility in the education system, so that students depending upon their interests can choose inter-disciplinary, intra-disciplinary and skillbased courses. It should be holistic to train the student into a perfect human being and a useful member of society. The aim of higher education is to develop good, well rounded and creative individuals. It has to enable an individual to study one or more specialized areas of interest at a deeper level, while at the same time building character, ethical and constitutional values, intellectual curiosity, spirit of service and capabilities across disciplines including sciences, social sciences, arts, humanities as well as professional, technical and vocational crafts. At the society level higher education must enable development of an enlightened, socially conscious, knowledgeable and skilled nation that can uplift its people and construct and implement solutions to its own problems. It is also to bridge the increasing gap between an undergraduate degree and employability.

The New Education Policy (2019) initiated and developed by the Ministry of Human Resource Development (HRD), Govt. of India, has been approved by the Central cabinet on 29th July 2020. The National Education Policy (NEP) has brought several reforms in Indian education which includes broad based multidisciplinary Undergraduate Education with 21st Century skills while developing specialized knowledge with disciplinary rigor. It is to bring equity, efficiency and academic excellence in National Higher Education System. The important ones include innovation and improvement in course-curricula, introduction of paradigm shift in learning and teaching pedagogy, evaluation and education system.

The role of Universities and colleges in the 21st Century extends far beyond traditional knowledge creation and dissemination to encompass new expectations for innovations that will have broader, social and economic benefits. To cater to the needs of students with diverse talents, aspirations and professional requirements, it is necessary to make qualitative changes in its undergraduate and postgraduate programmes. In this backdrop, the National Education Policy has recommended a Multi-disciplinary Undergraduate Programme with multiple exit and entry options with Certificate/Diploma/Degrees at each of the exits. A nationwide ecosystem of vibrant multi-disciplinary graded higher educational institutions (Universities and Colleges) are to be developed. In this context, a liberal approach has to be the basis of undergraduate education in all fields and disciplines at the undergraduate level, including professional education. Undergraduate curriculum needs to be focussed on creativity and innovation, critical thinking and higher order thinking capacities, problem solving abilities, team work, communication skills, more in-depth learning and mastery of curricula across fields.

The University Grants Commission has asked all the universities in the country to implement the multidisciplinary and holistic education across disciplines for a multidisciplinary



GUIDELINES FOR THE ORGANIZATION OF

CONFERENCES (INTERNATIONAL/NATIONAL)/SEMINARS/WORKSHOPS/WEBINARS

1. PREAMBLE

The role of a conference is to gather like-minded individuals from across the country or across the globe, to learn, discuss thoughts, network, share ideas, create new ideas, and to ignite motivation. The benefits of attending a conference are different for everyone. By attending a conference, individuals are expanding their professional and personal development, and are provided with insightful information that could not be taught internally from within the organization or online. On the other hand, the Seminars/Workshops/Webinars are the most important training and knowledge sharing mechanisms. When properly designed, they are a time and cost efficient method of producing active involvement of learners compared to individual training/learning activities. The Seminars/Workshops/Webinars are the learning and teaching arrangements which allow for active participation of participants, and they are usually conducted in small groups. In this context, these guidelines are introduced in order to provide financial assistance so as to enable the departments to organize seminars/ workshops/ conferences which will promote academic quality in the university with a proper administrative process.

2. OBJECTIVES

The scheme provides financial assistance to departments/centre for organizing Conferences and Workshops at State, National and International levels in various fields. Further, the scheme intends to promote high standards in university by way of extending facilities to teachers, researchers and students, by providing a forum for sharing their knowledge, experiences and research findings. The basic objective of the scheme is to bring together academicians and experts from different parts of the country and abroad to exchange knowledge and ideas. This will provide an in-depth analysis of subjects and update the knowledge of the participants from academic/research institutions. In addition, the proposed programme shall promote and encourage sharing of information amongst participants, provide educational sessions and sometimes technological displays encompassing the best and most current information in the particular field and to generate activities of professional association.

3. NATURE OF ASSISTANCE AVAILABLE UNDER THE SCHEME

Activities organized in collaboration with recognized academic associations/academic bodies, academic/professional institutions, associations of business/industry, voluntary organizations, NGOs and registered societies/trusts may be encouraged. In case of collaboration, a letter from the academic association/academic body or academic/ professional institution, association of business/industry, voluntary organization, NGO, registered society/trust, as applicable, may be furnished with the application. There shall be a Call for Papers and Delegate Participation through academic journals/website. For State/National level activities, the participants may be provided free board and lodging by the host institutions, wherever it is possible. Participants may be charged registration fees. The nature of assistance (maximum grants) available under the scheme to departments/constituent colleges shall be fixed as follows:

State Level Seminar/Conference : `. 75,000/ National Level Seminar/Conference : `. 1,25,000/ International Seminar/Conference : `. 2,00,000/-

• Workshops/Faculty Development Programme:

Online : `. 75,000/-Offline : `. 1,50,000/-

Webinars (ONLINE MODE ONLY):

National/International : `. 20,000/-State/Regional : `. 10,000/-

Duration of Programme:

In general, the minimum duration of the programme shall be as follows:

State/National Level Seminar/Conference : Two days
 International Level Seminar/Conference : Three days
 Workshops/Faculty Development Programme : Six days

(International/National/State/Regional level)

• Webinars (International/National/State/Regional level) : One/Two days

The grant may be used for the following items:

- TA (within India and as per university rules) and honorarium of `. 3000/- per session for Resource Persons not belonging to the host institution.
- Pre-conference printing (announcements, abstracts, etc.)
- Publication of Proceedings
- Local hospitality, including boarding and lodging to the outstation resource persons

4. PROCEDURE OF APPLYING FOR THE SCHEME

The departments which wishes to avail of financial assistance under this scheme shall submit their proposal to the university with an approval by the Departmental Council. The funds once released/sanctioned for organizing a particular activity cannot be utilized for any other Programme. A department may submit the proposal well in advance and any number of proposals shall be submitted by the department and proposals may be sent any time during the year.

5. PROCEDURE OF APPROVAL

The Expert Committee will consider the proposals and give recommendations. The final decision will be taken by the university, keeping in view the recommendations made by the Expert Committee, the availability of funds for the scheme and the number of proposals submitted by the Department. An equal priority shall be given to all the departments and the grants are allocated on a case-to-case basis. 
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

MEMORANDUM of UNDERSTANDING

the UNIVERSITY of WARSAW

MANGALORE UNIVERSITY

The University of Warsaw (hereinafter referred to as UW), a public university with its seat in Krakowskie Przedmieście 26/28, 00-927 Warszawa, Poland, represented in this act by its Rector, Prof. Alojzy Z. Nowak, and the Mangalore University, a public university (hereinafter referred to as MU), with its seat in Mangalagangothri, Mangaluru, Karnataka, India, represented in this act by its Registrar, Mr. K. Raju Mogaveera KAS, hereinafter both universities referred to as "the Parties", establish hereby a formal understanding on cooperation and friendship which is intended to further the academic objectives of each institution and to promote better understanding between the faculty and students of both Parties.

Initially the cooperation will be executed by the following units:

- at UW Faculty of Political Science and International Studies;
- at MU Department of Political Science

The Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) is open to all other areas being of common interest.

Under this Memorandum of Understanding, the two Parties will proceed to implement the following endeavors and exchanges of materials and personnel:

Areas of cooperation

Cooperation shall be carried out, subject of availability of funds and approval of the authorities of Parties, in the areas being subject of mutual interest, through such activities or programmes as:

- 1. Exchange of faculty members
- 2. Exchange of students, including PhD
- Joint research activities
- 4. Participation in seminars and academic meetings
- Exchange of academic materials
- 6. Special short-term academic programmes

Terms of such mutual cooperation and necessary budget for each specific programme and activity that is implemented under the terms of this MoU shall be mutually agreed upon in writing by both Parties prior to the initiation of the particular programme or activity.

UW designates herewith Dr. Jakub Zajączkowski (Faculty of Political Science and International Studies) as a Coordinator and contact person with regard to initial implementation of the present MoU.

MU designates herewith Prof. Jayaraj Amin (Department of Political Science) as Coordinator and contact person with regard to the initial implementation of the present MoU.

Scope of the Cooperation

Areas of cooperation include, subject to mutual consent, any programme offered at either Party # felt desirable or feasible on either party and that both Parties feel can contribute to the fostering and development of the cooperative relationships between the two institutions.

Implementation

The present Memorandum of Understanding shall remain in force for a period of five (5) years from the date it is signed by legal representatives of both Parties. It may further be extended or amended upon a written consent of both Parties. This MoU may be terminated by either Party, subject to delivery of six-month advance notice, in writing.

Intellectual property

Intellectual property rights of jointly prepared publications, curricula and other materials being results of cooperation shall be safeguarded according to legal regulations being in force at both institutions.

Disputes

Any disputes that may arise during implementation of the present MoU, shall be settled amicably.

Final Provisions

Both Parties understand that all final arrangements will have to be negotiated and will depend on the availability of funds.

During implementation of the present MoU both Parties shall comply with legal regulations being in force in both countries.

This MoU was made in two equivalent copies in English, with one copy for each Party.
